

DON'T FEED WILDLIFE



Do not encourage wildlife by feeding or leaving food for them.

Bird strikes can cause significant damage to aircraft and lead to

life-threatening incidents.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Birds gathering near or on airports can become victims of bird-aircraft collisions, potentially causing flight delays, damage to aircraft, and loss of human life.
- Wildlife-aircraft strikes have resulted in the loss of hundreds of lives worldwide, as well as billions of dollars in aircraft damage over the last century.
- You are not allowed to have a bird feeder on airport property.
- Bird feed also attracts rats, raccoons, squirrels and skunks among other rodents.
- CYYF has a Wildlife Management Plan that is approved by the Transport Canada Civil Aviation to reduce wildlife hazards.
- Airport staff works to reduce wildlife attractants like ledges, structures and trees where animals like to nest.
- Airport staff utilizes noisemakers to chase wildlife away from the airfield.
- Feeding wildlife promotes return of the animal and habituation to humans which can be extremely detrimental to the safety of the animal.
- Feeding wildlife leads to public health concerns. Too many animals in one place increases the chance of disease transmission to people and among other wildlife.
